- Monthly country music jamborees
- One of the few remaining intact wooden water towers in the province.
- Annual wagon trek follows Carlton Trail to Lindbergh.
- Access to Whitney Lakes Provincial Park, Fishing Lake Métis Settlement where the annual Potta Trail Days festival takes place in late July and Frog Lake First Nation where the Riel Rebellion took place. This historic site is about 20km. east of Heinsburg.
