

















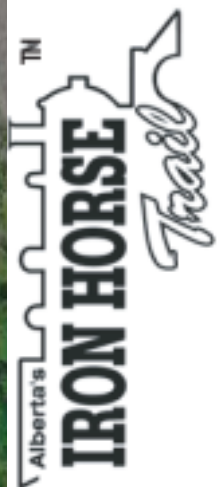


St. Paul Trail Map

-Home of artist Herman Poulin who carved three statues using a chain saw. One is of Peter Fiddler, Alberta's first surveyor. This statue stands on the North Hill, overlooking Elk Point. The second is of fur trader Angus Shaw who was the first European to come to the area in the 1700's. This statue greets visitors at the entrance to the Bonnyville Museum. The third statue, located in Lac La Biche, is of explorer, David Thompson.
